## The Salvington Circuit

The Salvington circuit has ten sets of seven primary spheres each:

- 1. the Melchizedek worlds
- 2. the Vorondadek worlds
- 3. the Lanonandek worlds
- 4. the Life Carrier worlds
- 5. the finaliter worlds (i.e., the Paradise Corps of the Finality)
- 6. the worlds of the Brilliant Evening Stars
- 7. the worlds of the archangels
- 8. the worlds of the Spirit-fused mortals
- 9. the worlds of the seraphim
- 10. the worlds of the Nebadon Corps of the Finality\*
- \* The Magisterial Sons as fused with the soul(s) from their incarnations are an extraordinary class of the ascending Sons of a local universe.

Notice the parallel pattern with the two finality corps. The worlds of the Paradise corps follow the worlds of the local universe Sons, while the worlds of the Nebadon corps follow the worlds of the beings who are the parallel coordinates of the four orders of local universe Sons.

The existence of the "Nebadon Corps of the Finality" is disclosed in paragraph 188:3.8 of The Urantia Book; however, the nature of the tenth set of seven primary spheres in the Salvington circuit is not directly disclosed. Each of the nine other sets of worlds is "sequentially" revealed, beginning in Paper 35, and ending in Paper 38. Since Paper 39 is also about "The Seraphic Hosts", that leaves only Paper 40, "The Ascending Sons of God", to be related to the tenth set of worlds.
